TARGETTI LIGHT ART COLLECTION Light Art May 03 to June 15, 2018

On 03 May 2018, SL Gallery presents *Light Art*, an exhibition of select works from the prestigious **Targetti Light Art Collection** in collaboration with O'Blaney Rinker & Associates.

Just as classical art was inspired by nature, so we, the offspring of technological evolution, cannot ignore the inspiration that comes to us from the world of technology we have created.

The *Light Art* collection examines how investigation into the chromatic values of light has been carried out throughout the history of art from the very beginning up until the most recent developments. "Light without limits" is the Targetti philosophy that embodies the idea of the Collection. It springs from the knowledge of being able to combine technology and industrial design based on the principles of the performance and function of light. The Collection is inspired by Italian poet Filippo Tommaso Marinetti's idea that "the only art that is alive is one that finds its elements in the surrounding environment." (*Futurist Manifesto*, 1909).

The exhibition consists of two pieces from the collection, *Laboratorio* by Fabrizio Corneli and *Girl With Ice Cream* by Aleksandra Stratimirovic. Although vastly different in medium and interpretation of the subject, both pieces demonstrate the idea that light exists and is defined by the non-light; an eternal balancing process where light and non-light define one another. In both cases, the artworks express sophisticated concepts using the language of light with practically zero technology involved. Corneli and Stratimirovic rely on their intelligence and sensitivity to explain a complex idea in the clearest way; the artists are training viewers to see with their brains rather than their eye.

FABRIZIO CORNELI is an Italian artist, famous for his work in Shadow art. He studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Florence where he graduated in 1980. His first show "Le Alternative del Nuovo" was held in 1979 at the Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome where he exhibited works using shadows and light. Since 1979 the artist has held numerous solo and group exhibitions in several venues around the world including the Gallery Mssohkan, Tokyo Metropolitan Museum of Photography and Yokohama Portside Gallery. Fabrizio Corneli currently lives and works in Florence.

ALEKSANDRA STRATIMIROVIC is a Swedish artist with a special interest in light. She graduated from the University of Arts in Belgrade where she studied Applied Arts and Design. She is internationally recognized and active in the world of art and light with professional experience of 20+ years in the field. Several of Stratimirovic's permanent site-specific works can be found in various public places in Sweden and abroad, including hospitals, schools, train stations and residential areas. In recent

years her work has been included in exhibitions at the Guggenheim Museum, New York, Konstnärshuset in Stockholm, Jardin du Palais Royal in Paris, and various institutions and events in London, Amsterdam, Ljubljana, Belgrade, Tokyo, Osaka, Verona, Singapore, and Stockholm. She has received a number of national and international awards for her art, including the "Targetti Light Art Award" in 2008 for *Girl With Ice Cream*. Aleksandra Stratimirovic lives and works in Stockholm, Sweden.







FABRIZIO CORNELI is an Italian artist, famous for his work in Shadow art. He studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Florence where he graduated in 1980. His first show "Le Alternative del Nuovo" was held in 1979 at the Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome where he exhibited works using shadows and light. Since 1979 the artist has held numerous solo and group exhibitions in several venues around the world including the Gallery Mssohkan, Tokyo Metropolitan Museum of Photography and Yokohama Portside Gallery. Fabrizio Corneli currently lives and works in Florence.

1976

Graduated from Liceo G. Galilei, a secondary school for scientific studies, in Siena.

Studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Florence where he graduated in 1980. For two years he attended courses in semiology at the DAMS Institute at the Literature Department of the University of Bologna

1979

First show: "Le Alternative del Nuovo" held at the Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome; exhibited works using shadows and light, elements that would distinguish his work over time

1986

Invited to the Maryland Institute in Baltimore to hold a workshop and lessons. The same year one of his works was acquired for the Civiche raccolte d'arte di Milano (the Milano City Art Collections)
